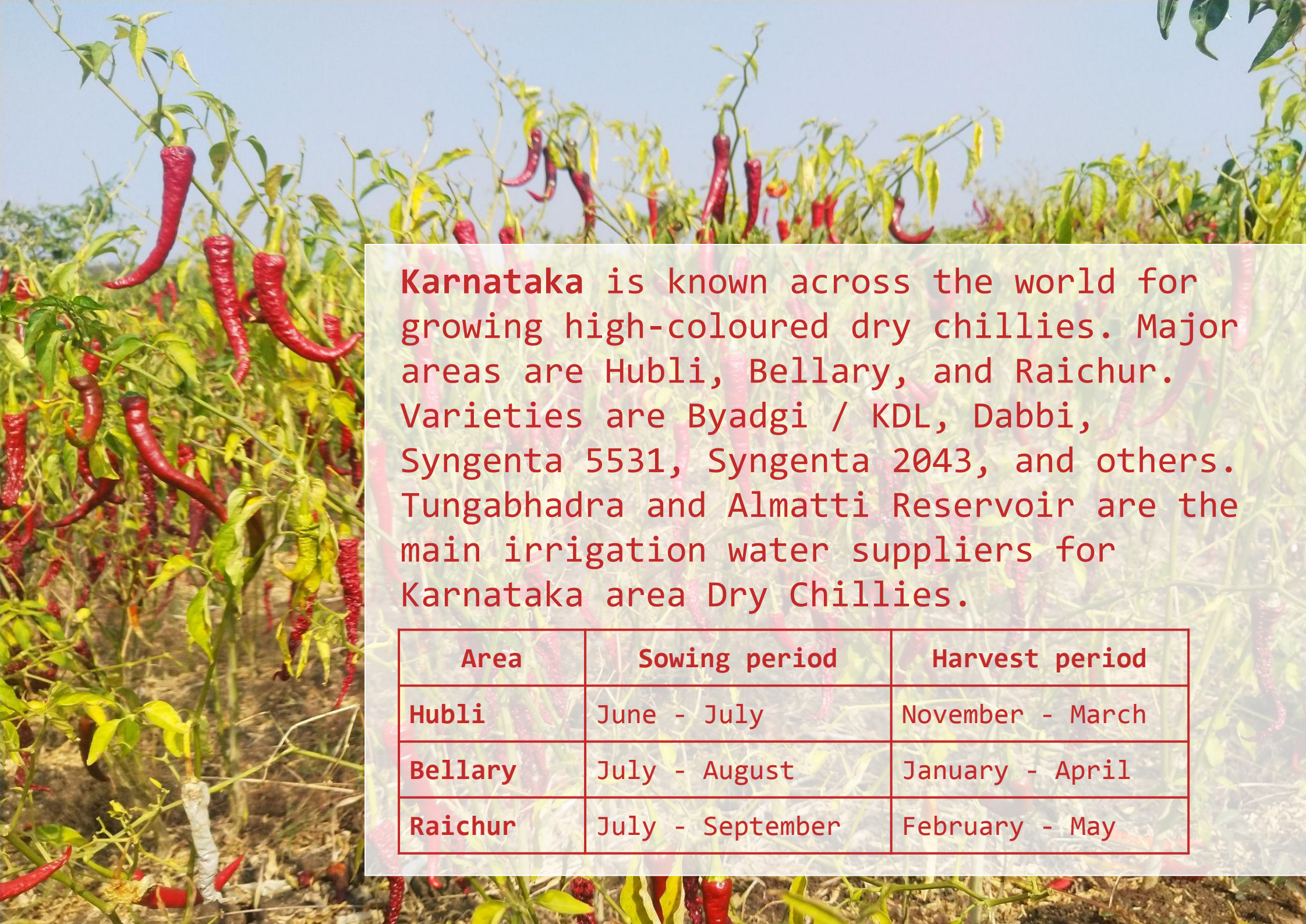

Karnataka Dry Chilli Outlook: April 2024

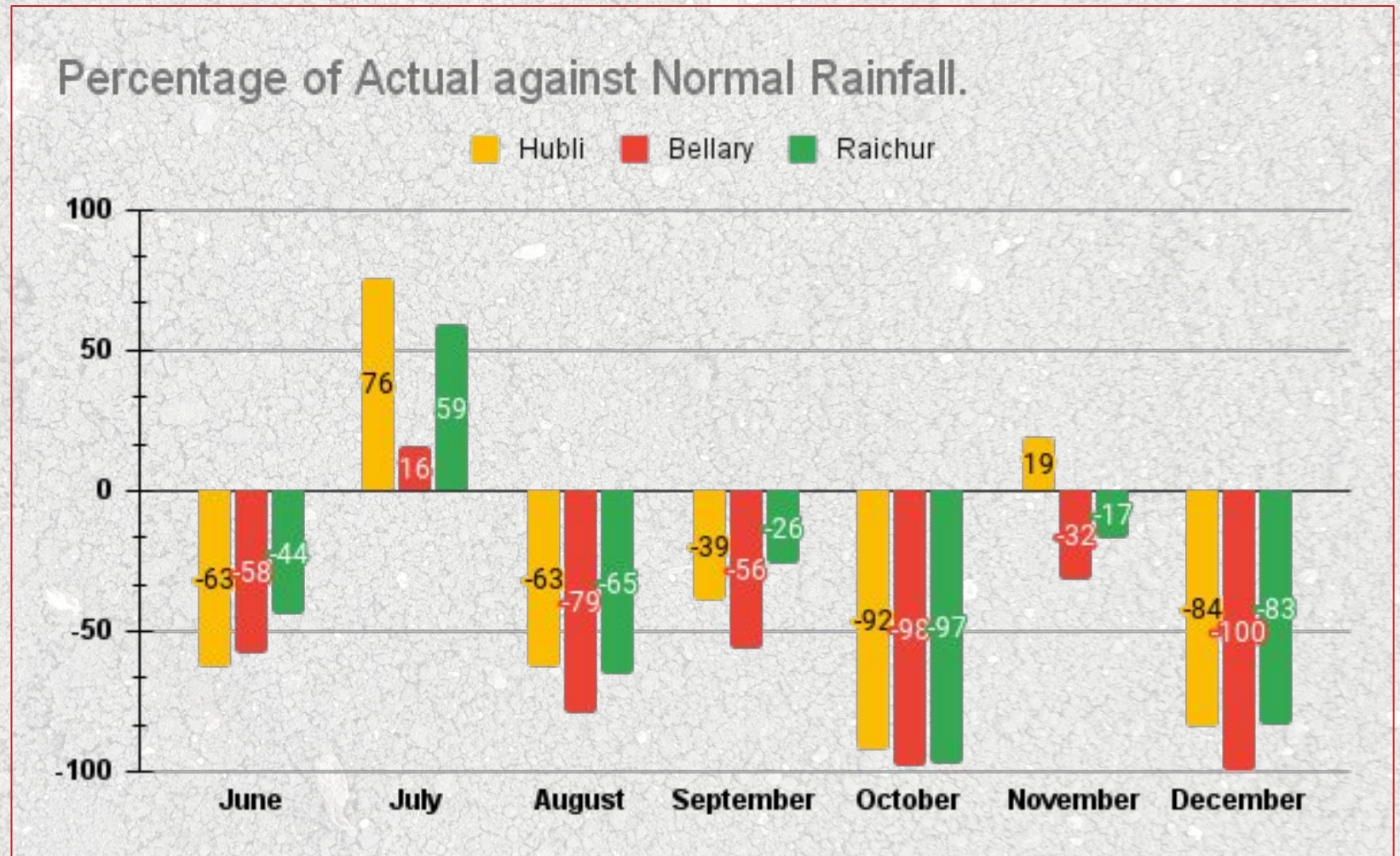

Karnataka is known across the world for growing high-coloured dry chillies. Major areas are Hubli, Bellary, and Raichur. Varieties are Byadgi / KDL, Dabbi, Syngenta 5531, Syngenta 2043, and others. Tungabhadra and Almatti Reservoir are the main irrigation water suppliers for Karnataka area Dry Chillies.

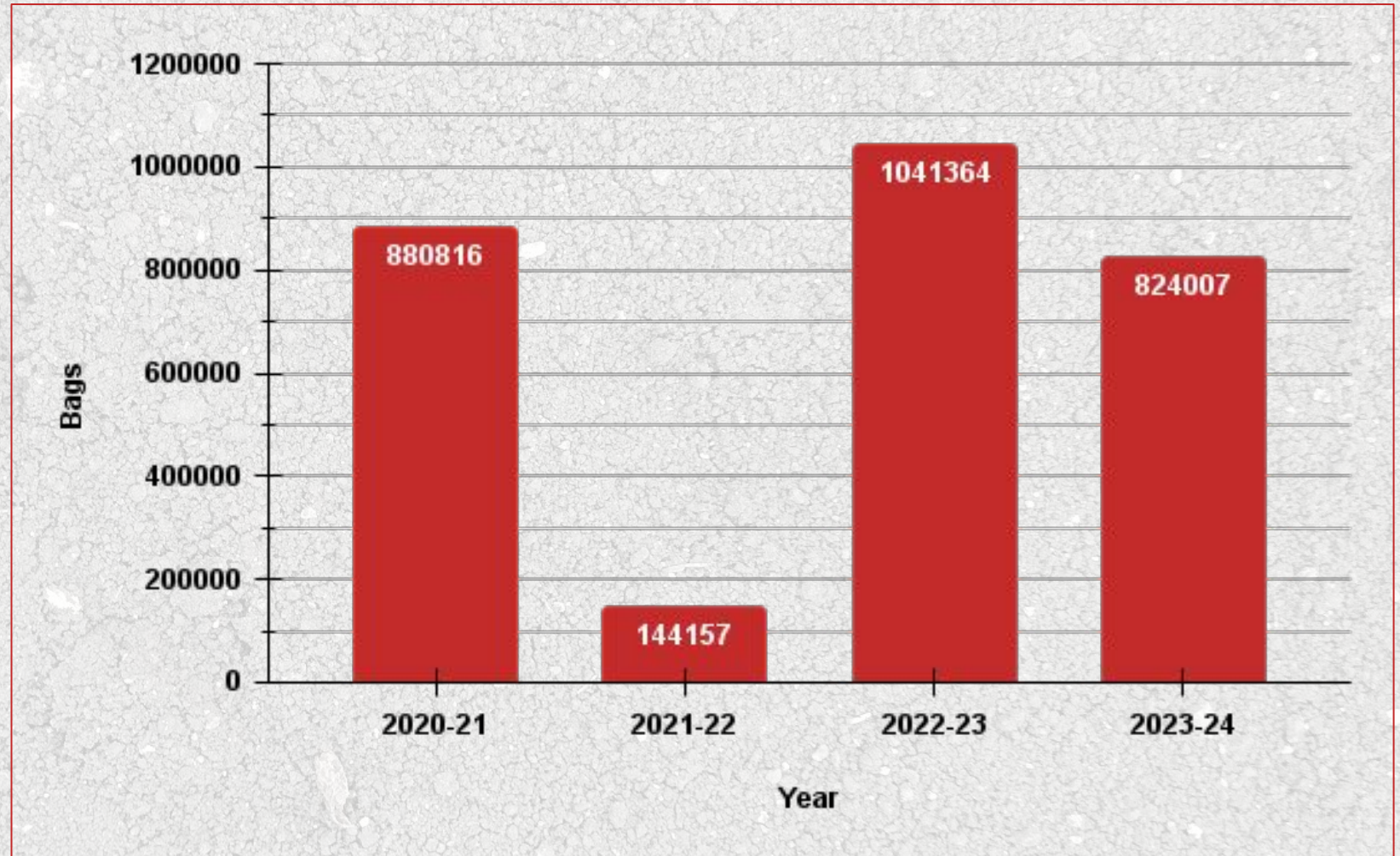

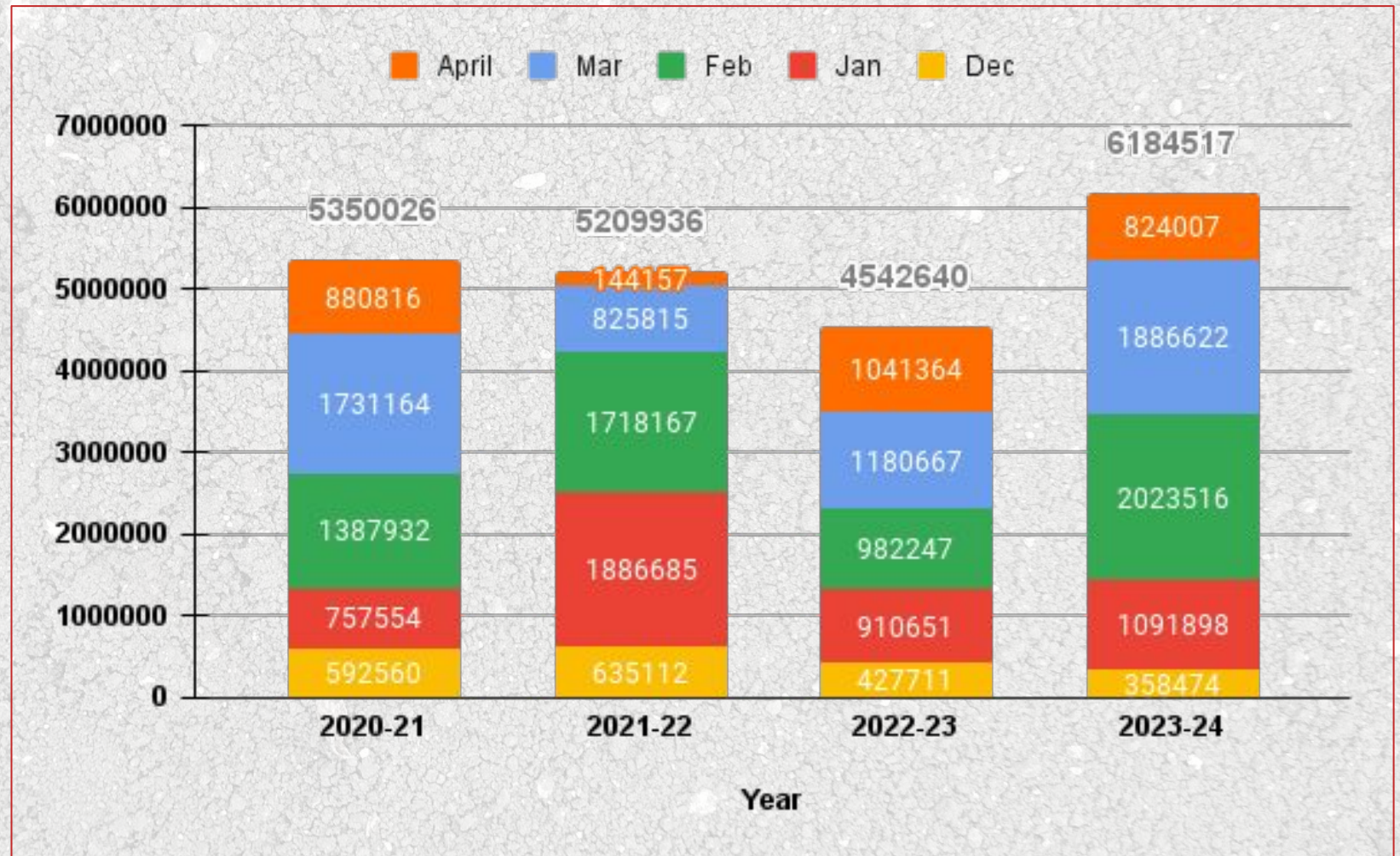

April 2024 Summarized

- ❖ Compared with last year, arrivals are 20% less for April month.
- ❖ Compared with last year, arrivals from December to April have increased by 35%.
- ❖ This year temperature has increased drastically, thus affecting color value for chillies in month of April
- ❖ Karnataka has about 80+ lakh bags cold storage capacity and its completely occupied.
- ❖ This year's arrivals are record breaking for Karnataka, in last 5 years this is first time we have crossed 60 lakh bags arrivals.

The Hubli area is known for growing Byadgi chilli in a traditional organic way. This chilli always gets premium pricing due to lower yield but of higher quality. But this year due to over flooding from irrigated areas, this chilli was trading at very low prices, this has made farmers move their produce to cold storages.

History:

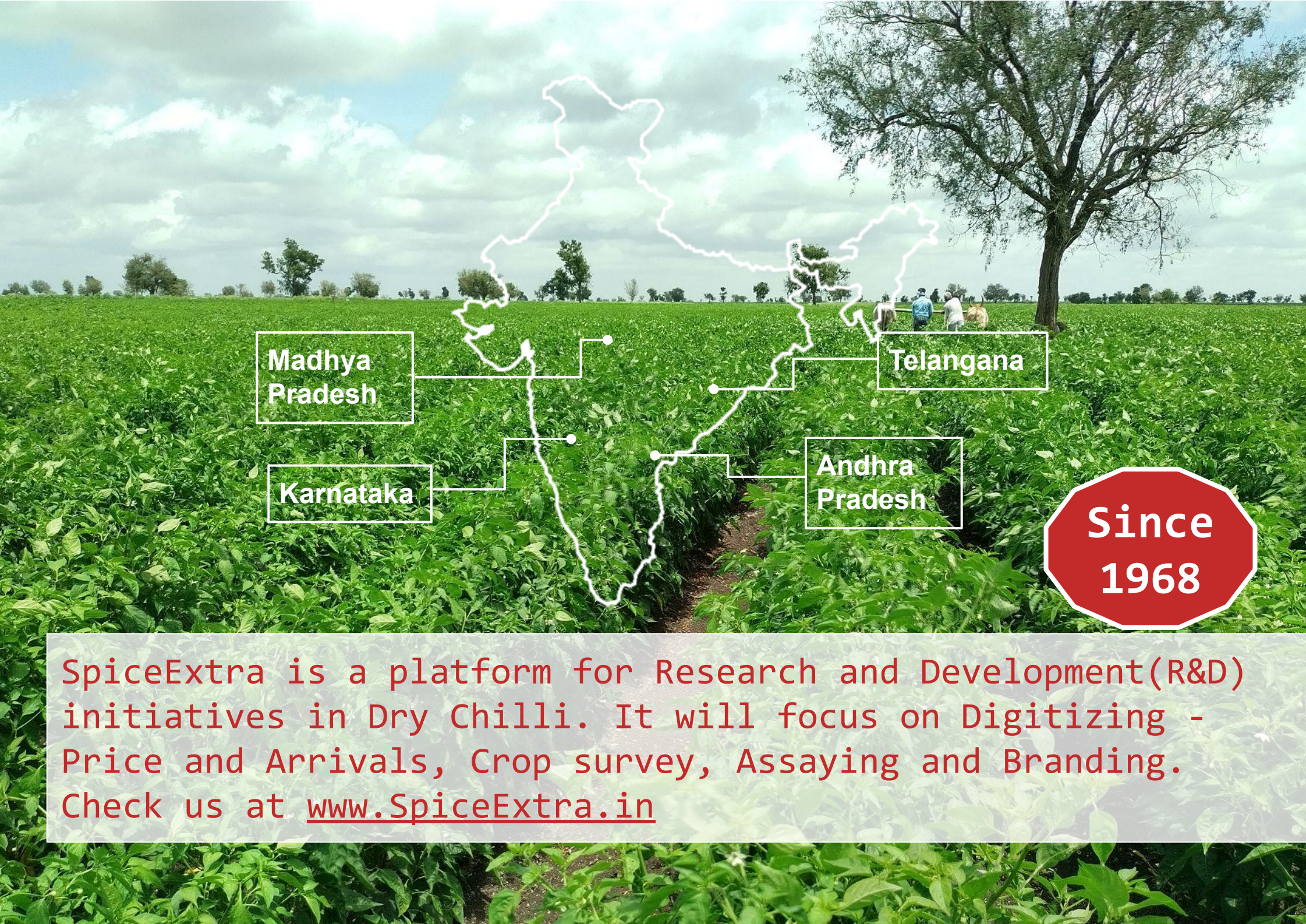
